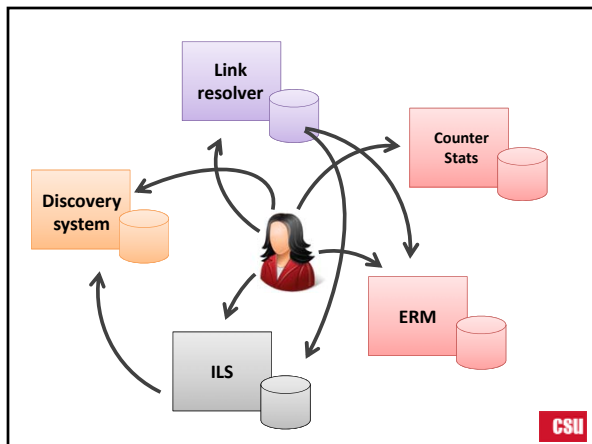

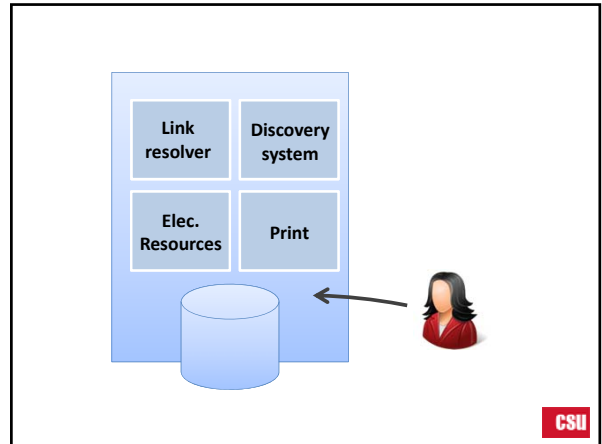
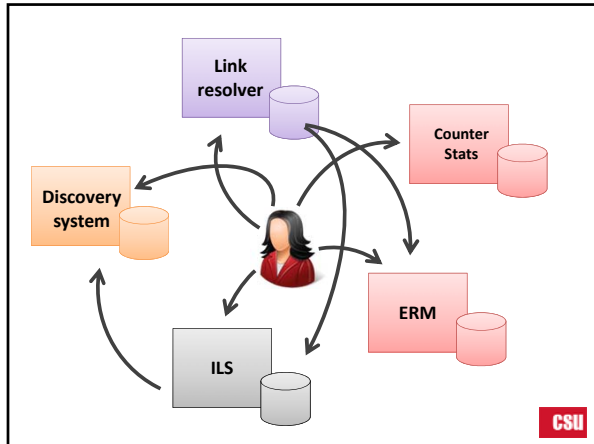



Productivity costs (2013)

“It’s a real pain to maintain ER information across multiple silos -- our local ERM, Ser Sol, SFX, MetaLib, and our local catalog. Sometimes it feels like triple (or even quadruple) work to implement even one database or ejournal package.

“What should be a simple [task] becomes several days of cleanup work for 4+ people to reconcile title lists, check URL/access functionality, and fix minimal records.”

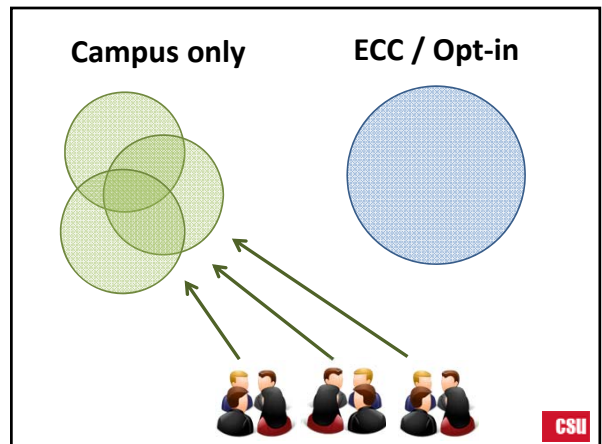
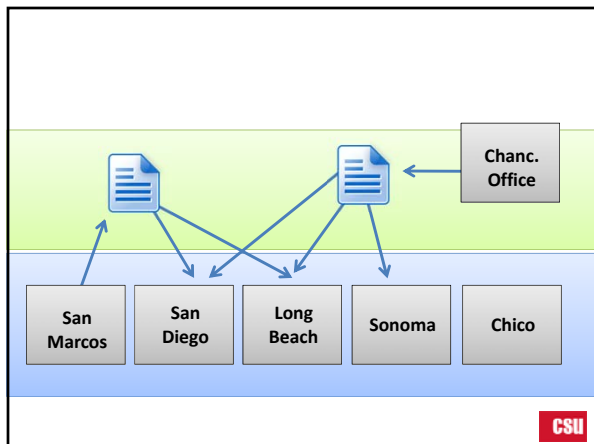
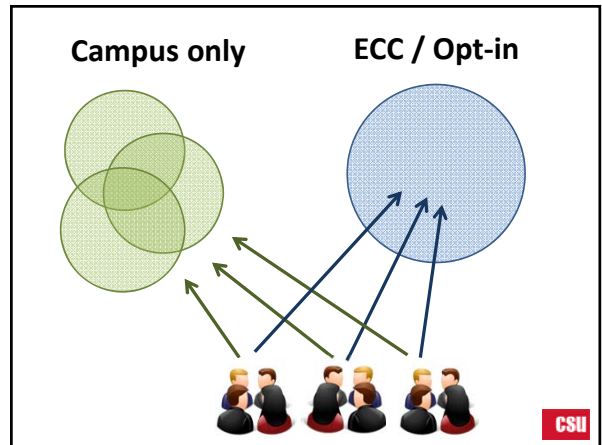
